About the College...

- The College operates under the leadership and stewardship of its Council. Council's primary role is to ensure that the interests of the public are protected and maintained.
- Members of Council include 7 elected pharmacists, 1 elected pharmacy technician and 4 members of the public who are appointed by government.
- Council is the policy-making group and board of directors for the College. The College's administrative staff is responsible for carrying out these policies and administering the Regulated Health Professions Act, the Pharmacy Act and associated regulations. The College is required to fulfill the role of a regulatory college established in this legislation. All Council decisions must be consistent with this legislation

What is the time commitment?

The Council meets 9 times per year for 2 hours (3rd Tuesday evening of the month from 6:30-8:30 pm). In addition, Council members may participate on the Executive Committee and other committee and working groups of the College.
