College Releases Guidance in Medical Assistance in Dying-UPDATE

The Council of the PEI College of Pharmacists approved a guidance document that provides direction for pharmacists and pharmacy technicians with respect to their participation in Medical Assistance in Dying. On June 17, 2016 Bill C-14, *An Act to amend the Criminal Code and to make related amendments to other Acts (medical assistance in dying)* received royal assent making the bill a law in Canada. The Bill provided exemptions from criminal prosecution under the Criminal Code of Canada for pharmacists who participated in Medical Assistance in Dying (MAID). Details around the provision of MAID in PEI continue to evolve. The PEI College of Pharmacist will continue to provide information as it becomes available.
