In order to better characterize the pharmacists' experiences in this area, Dalhousie University and the University of Sydney are conducting a 2-nation survey across Australia and Canada. This will give the opportunity for analysis of experiences across regions and between countries with many similarities, including focused research programs of community pharmacy-based mental health care. This survey will help to inform future intervention development and implementation to help pharmacists in their care of patients at risk of suicide. Pharmacists who are currently working or who have previously worked in a community pharmacy are invited to participate in a survey *Pharmacists' Care of People at Risk of Suicide*.
