Narcotic and Controlled Drug Reconciliation

As of November 2011, the PEI College of Pharmacist has a requirement around narcotic and controlled drug reconciliation in pharmacies. The reconciliation process was implemented to assist in assuring that the narcotic and controlled drugs in the pharmacy are secure from internal loss, theft and diversion. Pharmacy managers are responsible for ensuring that the reconciliation process has been completed and consists of 4 steps:

- Physical inventory reconciled with Computer or Manual Perpetual Inventory
- Invoices reconciled with Purchase Record
- Sales Report reconciled with Filed Prescriptions
- Reconciliation of Purchases and Sales Records
