



## RP. 05 Students and Provisional Registrants Administering Injections

*PEI College of Pharmacy policies, together with legislation, practice directives, standards and guidelines outline the practice expectations of pharmacists and pharmacy technicians in the province.*

*Policies use “must” to indicate an action that is mandatory for a pharmacy professional. Policies use “may” to indicate that the registrant may use professional discretion.*

### Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to further define requirements for pharmacy students, pharmacy technician students, provisional pharmacists, and provisional pharmacy technicians to administer injections.

### Application

This policy is applicable to pharmacy students, pharmacy technician students, provisional pharmacists, and provisional pharmacy technicians.

### Policy

Pharmacy students, pharmacy technician students, provisional pharmacists and provisional pharmacy technicians may administer drug therapy by injection under the following conditions.

The pharmacy student, pharmacy technician student, provisional pharmacist or provisional pharmacy technician must:

1. Be registered with PEICP and meet all registration requirements, including first aid/CPR and professional liability insurance.
2. For pharmacy students and provisional pharmacists:
  - a. Have successfully completed a CCCEP competency mapped accredited program (i.e. Dalhousie IIATP) OR received their education and training on the administration of injections as part of the pharmacy program core curriculum.
3. For pharmacy technician students and provisional pharmacy technicians:

- a. Have successfully completed a CCCEP competency mapped accredited program in immunization and injection (i.e. Dalhousie CPE PTADI program).
4. Be under the direct supervision<sup>1</sup> of a pharmacist who holds an extended practice certificate in drug administration.
5. Complete a record of injections to submit with initial application for an extended practice certificate in drug administration when registering as a pharmacist in the general class or a pharmacy technician in the general class.

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<sup>1</sup> Direct supervision means that the pharmacist supervising must be physically present in the pharmacy.
